

Matrics of 2016 Deliver

The matric class of 2016 has delivered on their potential with astoundingly good results.

Rhenish Girls' High is pleased that the 100% pass rate – maintained for over thirty years – has once again been achieved. In addition, 98,7% of the class of 139 girls achieved a Bachelor's Pass which enables them to further their studies at tertiary level.

Rhenish's top achiever, Priyanka Govender, garnered 8 distinctions and her average of 95,3% has secured her a spot in the Top 20 in the Western Cape. Priyanka is delighted with her results and intends to further her studies in 2017 at Stellenbosch University where she will be studying Engineering (Mechatronics).

The matric class produced:

- 49 A candidates
- 461 subject distinctions
- 1 learner with 9 distinctions; 4 learners with 8 distinctions; 9 learners with 7 distinctions
- 10 learners with an average of over 90%
