Why the Hype? Why the Fuss?

Speak to any Rhenish Old Girl and one of the first things she will speak of will be 4M. The often unbearable heat in Paarl; the hours of practising the Rhenish cheer; the bus trip to Paarl that leaves your ears ringing with the singing of the school cheers and the stifling almost claustrophobia of the stands. But, she will also smile fondly and chatter away enthusiastically about the laughter shared on the stands, the shouting until you feel your lungs will burst and you are hoarse for days after. She will try to explain the inexplicable - the feeling of belonging and of being part of something bigger than yourself. This is 4M. This is why we do it.

The Annual 4M competition between the four girls' schools in the Boland has deep roots. This year was the 30th 4M. The competition on the day is fierce - athletes have been training for months for this moment.

The Rhenish 4M athletics team has a number of very talented



specialist athletes, and this is their moment to shine. It is the only time that they are able to perform in front of their peers. We do not have the depth in terms of participants that the other schools have - more of our girls play hockey or swim or play water polo - and so we will probably not be truly competitive as a school at this event.

That being said, we did have some stand out performances by individual athletes, most notable among these is our U14 Javelin thrower, Nicola van der Merwe, who broke the record by 5m with a throw of 43,15m. Her performance also earned her the prize for the best performance in a field event in the Junior category.

Remember the words from our school song, "... we may not all be brilliant/ at sport not all do well / but the hope of each and all of us / is that Rhenish may excel." Ironically, this speaks so to our 4M experience. Some athletes excelled, others did less well, but Rhenish Girls' High excelled as a school with an outstanding display of sisterhood and spirit.

BLESS A BABY



Last Saturday the GLU committee girls went to El Shaddai Christian School to meet the organisers of the "Bless A Baby" Project. This is a non-profit organisation run by a group of amazing women who started the charity over 20 years ago. When they heard about moms who have to leave hospital without anything for their babies (no blankets, nappies or even clothes) only six hours after giving birth, the women knew they wanted to help.

"Bless A Baby" aims to supply the new moms with small bags containing necessary items to help moms with their newborn children.

The Rhenish group were given the opportunity to help out on Saturday morning. GLU aims to get our school behind a project to support "Bless A Baby" this year.



We added blankets, nappies, face clothes, a set of clothes for the baby's first 0-3months and one for 3-6 months to the bags. This is often the only clothes the newborns have for the first six months of their lives. We further included 3 children's books, a teddy for each baby and other essential items.
