In the run up to the event, La Rochelle had invited the Rhenish squad to a fun afternoon at their pool last Thursday.






























































very member of the 4M team swam their hearts out in the pool and it showed.





### A TOUR OF THE HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS





## A GROUP OF AROUND 40 GRADE 10 - 12 LEARNERS WENT ON A TOUR OF HISTORICAL AND ICONIC PARTS OF CAPE TOWN ON 24 - 26 FEBRUARY.

On Friday morning we woke up bright and early to get on the bus to our first stop, the Cape Town Holocaust Centre.

Here we were welcomed by the incredibly hospitable staff who really made the museum much more emotional and thought provoking for everyone. We were touched by their care and it set the tone for the day ahead.

We walked through the city, past Parliament, the Town Hall and the Grand Parade to get to our second stop of the day, the Castle of Good Hope where we walked through their military museum. We were surprised to hear that our very own Mr van der Hoven had contributed to this museum. We visited the William Fehr art collection and had a brief guided tour that included the torture room - a highlight for many of us.

We split up into groups and spent some time on St George's Mall where we bought and enjoyed lunch before meeting up again to walk to our last museum of the day, the District Six museum.

A lot of us were looking forward to this museum because of our Grade 9 coursework, a book written by a former resident of District Six. We were not disappointed; we were taken around the museum by three former residents of District Six.

The small but informative museum was packed full of historical artefacts of the area, moving photographs and beautiful tapestries all donated by previous residents. Our guides added a personal but funny touch to the museum with the stories they shared and we were fascinated by their perspectives.ere fascinating.

We headed off to our final destination for the day - Bo-Kaap. Our route took us via the Company Gardens, where we enjoyed a brief moment resting in the sun surrounded by birds and squirrels.

We continued walking to Wale Street where we saw the first established mosque in South Africa, the Auwal Mosque, finally arriving in Bo-Kaap to the colourful display of the iconic

Ro-Kaan houses








We went on a bus around the island with a very funny tour guide and stopped for a moment next to the sea, which had a beautiful view of Table Mountain.

After a rather turbulent boat trip back to the Waterfront, we collected our lunches and ate onboard the bus as we made our way to Table Mountain.

It was a wonderfully clear afternoon for the cable car ride to the top of the mountain were we enjoyed stunning 360 degree views of Cape Town. Eventually, having had something to eat and drink, the cold wind typical of the mountain at this time of the year, drove us down the mountain and back home.


