



Just keep knitting

Bless-a-Baby, an NPO that supports mothers and their babies with various things such as formula, diapers, blankets, and so much more at multiple hospitals in Cape Town and Winelands, was selected as the organisation that the RGHS ladies will support during the year.

The annual square knitting competition kicked off as the square that will be knitted by the learners will be sewn together and made into a blanket. The blankets will form part of the bags of care that will be donated to Bless-a-Baby.

Currently, the school has one class group that has knitted over 450 squares and a second group – with just over 200.

The steaks are high as the winning class (those who have completed and knitted the most squares) will be spoilt with pizza.



"It is part of the Core Values of the school to instil not only the ethos of sisterhood in our ladies but also an ethos of caring and community, and through this project, we do believe that the learners will find a better sense of community," says Angela Sarga, Acting Principal.










Once a Rhenisher, always a Rhenisher.



A WISH FOR OUR STARS...




Our two full-time psychologists offer safe and confidential spaces to support the emotional well-being of all learners at Rhenish.
