The 4M Athletics for 2024 turned out to be a memorable one. We started with a lovely breakfast, accompanied by old Rhenisher Tatum Ludick as our guest speaker. Her message was very appropriate for the day: athletics is not just about winning, it is about the lessons you learn along the way, the memories we cherish, and the friends you make.

Dal Josafat is not known to be a beautiful track, but with the help of the matric committee, the PTA moms and our ground staff, the pavilion and the athletes gazebos looked beautiful, setting a winning tone for the day.

Our athletes achieved 122 points this year, an improvement of almost 40 points from last year's total. Nicola van der Merwe was our top achiever of the day, winning the U15 Javelin with a new record of 44,27m and walking away with the Best Junior Field Performance of the day.

There were others who performed just as well. Mary Roux secured two medals: bronze in the U19 discus and a silver in the shotput. Pippa Viljoen came second in the 400m with a nail-biting finish. Harriet Smit ran a beautiful 1500m and finished third. Our U14s showed that they are a group to be reckoned with! Nina Watts secured two bronze medals in the 100m and 200m, and Michaela Modinger secured a bronze in the 400m.

The day ended with two incredible relays from our U14 and U17 teams. Our u14s shocked the other schools with a silver medal and our U17s were placed third in a photo finish. All in all, the fighting spirit of every Rhenisher is what stood out the most. We can be proud of what we have achieved and walk away with our heads held high. Rhenish, our blood is blue!




