After the five-hour drive, we arrived at Rogge Cloof Nature Reserve and Eco Farm, just outside Sutherland, where we stayed for two nights.

The South African Astronomical Observatory (SAAO) in Sutherland is the national centre for optical and infrared astronomy in South Africa. The town of Sutherland is the ideal location due to its height above sea level and its almost uninterrupted clear skies.

Almost immediately after we arrived, we drove into town for a show in the Sutherland Planetarium, which was followed by two hours of star gazing through the Planetarium's telescopes. Learners had the opportunity to look at Jupiter, The Jewel Box cluster close to the Southern Cross, a nebula inside Orion's belt and much more!

One highlight was the tour on Saturday morning at the Southern African Large Telescope (SALT), where we received an extra special tour from Mr Wiid, one of our Grade 12 parents who works at SALT. After the SALT tour, we were treated to a 4x4 drive in the nature reserve and an informative talk on fossils in a fossil field. Learners then had some free time to relax, study and burn marshmallows around the fire before a second stargazing evening at the farm.

We hope our learners enjoyed the tour and that this can become an annual event!

This schools' training initiative focusses on generating a genome sequence for a Veldkos | Fieldfood species lacking genetics or genomics information, whilst introducing high school learners to the exciting field of plant genomics to showcase what a career in science really looks like. Their data will also make a valuable contribution towards the creation of a draft reference genome for DIPLOMICS' 1KSA: Decoding biodiversity SA's initiative. Grootnoemnoem (Carissa macrocarpa) was chosen as the inaugural plant species for this project.

In a research team, there are typically various members, each with specific roles that complement one another. Research teams often consist of members from different institutions, contributing specific skills to the project.


Two of our grade 11 Life Sciences learners, Xenia McLachlan and Kaitlin Ernstze, are part of this team.




